OVERVIEW

The Asia Research Centre, Universitas Indonesia (ARC UI) was established to address the gap between Indonesia's potential in world and its academic capacity to understand and explain itself. ARC UI is a hub between disciplines, faculties, and universities in Asia within the social sciences and humanities, as well as civil society organisations and policy communities. It aims to become an academically rigorous organisation that nurtures deep interdisciplinary research which can be extended across the university and engages in high level international and inter-sectoral collaborations.

We held our first 2022 annual meeting in early 2023, involving our board of supervisory, research fellows, and executives of the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Universitas Indonesia. There, we reaffirmed our purpose to become a focal point for critical social sciences in Indonesia and Asia.



Director's Note

In its third year, the Asia Research Centre, Universitas Indonesia (ARC UI) continues to consolidate its academic agenda: making social sciences and humanities more relevant for people and policy. At the end of 2022, we reflected on the importance of interdisciplinary understanding of multidimensional crises and allocated our time and energy in 2023 to focus on unpacking old and new kinds of societal evolution and stagnation. In the process, we found allies and friends in our collaborators and supporters from partner universities, civil society organisations, and policy communities.

With the deepening of our research scope and the broadening of people and organisations involved, we face the social reality that with growth comes contradictions. We increasingly noticed that more organisational opportunities meant greater social responsibilities. We have also become increasingly aware of the unequal distribution of wealth and access across gender, generation, region, and class.

Our practical and theoretical understanding of inequalities led us to focus on redistribution, or the equalisation of the otherwise uneven allocation of resources and access to them. In all our research and academic labour, we problematise in different and specific ways how the concentration of power in the hands of a few has resulted in the marginalisation of many.

Such an endeavour requires going against the neoliberal idea of the university and the persistence of social conditions to which we are inevitably complicit, as well as regularly reiterating who we are as academics. This involves acknowledging that we are all, even if unequal, made vulnerable by structures that benefit a few. And, while the task of reading and writing may seem insignificant compared to the vast gap between our realities and ideals, listening to more and more academics and researchers speak up for themselves and for their communities continually fuels the collective will to carry on.

Based on our experience in 2023, having lost some battles and won some, the responsibility to carry on is both social and collective. This is a shared burden, which was passed on from our teachers and which we shall also pass on through all the social means available to us.

MEDIA DISCUSSION ON THE ELECTIONS



in collaboration with Harian Kompas, we held a panel discussion “Manuver Politik dan Pemilu Indonesia 2024” (Political Manoeuvring and the 2024 Indonesian Election) and published an article “Demokrasi Membutuhkan Daya Tahan” (Democracy Requires Endurance).



RESEARCH AREA

We started with a multi-country study on COVID-19 in Asia, which provided an opportunity for academics to work collaboratively in a way that promotes comparative understanding of the region, under the theme “Knowledge on Asia.” We used insights from the study to publish our first special issue with *Sojourn: Journal of Social Issues in Southeast Asia*.

We subsequently engaged in more research that explores Southeast Asian and Asian experiences and promoted the use of broader comparative insights in our analyses. Our research in 2023 includes a study on “Women and Girls Education in Southeast Asia” and “Islam and the Left in Indonesia” (which is part of a wider study comparing the experiences of Indonesia and Turkey).

Throughout 2023, we conducted more research under the theme “Social and Climate Justice in the Developing World,” taking the case of Indonesia to unpack extractive relationships that link the country with global capitalism. While continuing our research on “Reorganising Power Under Emerging Markets,” we added new research on “Democracy and Democratic Transformations in the Global South.”

With electoral politics heating up in Southeast Asia after the COVID-19 pandemic, we see the urgency to use insights from the research to reflect on the relationship between rising inequality and weaker democracy. Never on solid ground, democracy in Southeast Asia is now facing renewed stumbles that indicate a major setback. Understanding these closely intertwined and deeply consequential crises (and through our collaboration with Civil Society Organisations) may help us in expanding opportunities to strengthen democratic ideals.

RESEARCH EXPERTISE

The research we carried out in 2023 demonstrated our attempts to respond to ongoing multidimensional crisis through collaborative and interdisciplinary works by means of critical perspectives. By critical, we refer to the careful interrogation of mainstream and popular assumptions, in ways that allow the pursuing of new ways of questioning and researching the problems in hand, as needed.



Above is a living map of our research keywords, which is interdisciplinary in character and practice. It is generated bottom-up, being updated annually by our research fellows, therefore it will evolve with time. Our researchers tell us what is relevant in their field, and we connect their interests with like-minded researchers from other disciplines. Seeing this map transform as more academics work with us has been a pleasure.

ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT

Through our academic collaborations and mentoring activities, we deepened our engagement with critical social scientists engaging with working-class activists in the Asia region. We designed our activities in 2023 to promote interdisciplinary engagement and to connect university-based academics with activists and Civil Society Organisations. They gained insight from, and in return, shaped our research inquiries.


We are delighted to host the very first Historical Materialism (HM) conference to take place in Southeast Asia, in collaboration with Asian Labour Review (ALR) and IndoPROGRESS (IP). We situated the conference as part of the broader HM project to support the consolidation of inter-Asian critical scholar-activist networks.

Moreover, we worked with Asian studies centres across the globe in organising events to exchange our knowledge on Asia. We covered topics that are relevant to contemporary Asia: electoral politics, gig work politics, COVID-19 social protection response. We encouraged academics researching the broader Asia region to think comparatively to understand our own society.

We also took part in The 42nd Indonesia Forum Symposium for Postgraduate & Early Career Researcher, organised by The Indonesia Forum (IF), University of Melbourne. The theme of the symposium was "Reformasi 25 Years on: Opportunities and Challenges for Indonesian Society." There, we took part in a discussion panel that addressed challenges and opportunities of international collaborations.

Lastly, we carried out academic mentoring (inbound mobility) and academic exchange (outbound mobility) by organising and supporting different activities:

Historical Materialism Conference in Asia

This first HM conference to be held in Southeast Asia focuses on the theme “Asian Capitalist Conjuncture: Contradictions and Critiques” and took place in a hybrid format on August 25-26, 2023. The in-person meeting took place at Auditorium Komunikasi, Faculty of Social and political Sciences, Universitas Indonesia.

Keynote speeches were delivered by Prof. Neferti Xina M. Tardiar (Barnard College, Columbia University, New York City) on “Imperial War and Reproduction”) and Dr. Sylvia Tywon (University of California, Berkeley) on ‘Conjunctures of Turbulence: Reflections on Nation and Militarism, the Nature of the “Malari” Incident.’

Panel Discussion “Electoral Politics in Southeast Asia: The Case of Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Cambodia”

This panel discussion was collaboratively organised with PUSKAPOL (Center for Political Studies) Universitas Indonesia and Kurawal Foundation. In this panel discussion, we included academics and civil society perspectives to address the topic of democracy. Each speaker delivered a critical comment on the state of democracy, both its collapse and rise, as well as its relevance to the current situation. The panel discussion was held in a hybrid format on May 19, 2023.

COLLABORATION HIGHLIGHTS

Book Launch “Who Cares? COVID-19 Social Protection Responses in Southeast Asia”

The book includes both regional overview and country-specific chapters detailing the pandemic's economic impacts on various demographics and the corresponding social welfare programs. Emphasising the paradox that the most socially deprived individuals are disproportionately affected by crises like the pandemic, yet they receive the least social protection, the book raises awareness about this disparity. The discussions focuses on three key areas: (1) reflecting on the inequalities in COVID-19 responses across Southeast Asia, (2) examining social protection measures for marginalised groups during and after the pandemic, (3) exploring visions for post-pandemic recovery efforts. The book launch was held in a hybrid format on November 15, 2023.

Webinar “the Politics of Gig Work in Asia and Africa: Insights from Indonesia, India and South Africa”

This webinar sought to foster a transregional dialogue on gig work politics in Asian and African contexts, specifically focusing on Indonesia, South Africa, and India. The objectives included comparing and contrasting gig work trajectories, collective organising, and politics among gig workers in these countries. The goal was to understand how the politics of work shape the dynamics of uneven development in the 21st century. The webinar created a space for Afro-Asian co-production of knowledge, addressing global challenges and exploring the transformative potential of labour movements across the two continents. The webinar was held virtually on October, 17 2023. 

RELEVANCE

Throughout 2023, we diversified our researchers' output in ways that could improve our engagement with wider section of society. Such a strategy has improved our relevance for policy communities and the more general public.

In early 2023, our researchers who work under the theme "Social and Climate Justice in the Developing World" produced a policy paper on "Mainstreaming Climate-Resilient Low Carbon Development: A Case of the North Coastal Area of Jakarta." We also initiated a hearing session to discuss the policy paper with strategic actors in the Jakarta Provincial Government (Pemprov DKI Jakarta). They included the Deputy for Spatial Planning at the Regional Development Planning Agency (Deputi Bidang Tata Ruang Bappeda DKI Jakarta), the Environmental Agency (Dinas Lingkungan Hidup DKI Jakarta), and the Bureau of Development and Environment (Biro Pembangunan dan Lingkungan Hidup).

We also worked with popular media to respond to the contemporary situation. In late 2023, we collaborated with Kompas, the largest national Indonesian language newspaper in Indonesia, to organise a panel discussion on "Political Manoeuvring and the 2024 Indonesian Election." Insights from the panel discussion, gained from our research under the theme "Democracy and Democratic Transformations in the Global South," was covered in Kompas newspaper's main pages.

In addition, we worked with 360info, an Australian-based online media platform, to produce a special report on "Surviving the Pitfalls of Gig Work." The report, organised under our "Reorganising Power in Emerging Markets" research cluster, reflects on the experiences of South and Southeast Asia through six articles on gig work and its politics in Indonesia, Malaysia, India, and Nepal. The licensing of 360info's content under Creatives Commons 4.0 allows for the republication of each article by other media platform across Asia.

We plan to annually organise this sort of collaboration with Kompas and 360info (and other media platforms) as a way to mainstream insights from our academic research. The collaborations have added more values to our publications on an array of platform (the Jakarta Post, Melbourne Asia Review, Kompas Gramedia Publisher) and ARC UI's own social media account.

POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

Policy Engagement with Local Government in Jakarta Capital City "Mainstreaming Climate-Resilient Low Carbon Development: A Case of the North Coastal Area of Jakarta"

Policy Paper

The policy paper is a response to Jakarta Governor Regulation No. 90 of 2021 on Climate-Resilient Low-Carbon Regional Development Plans. It analyses the potential and limitations of plans to enhance climate-resilient basic services in North Jakarta's coastal areas. The analysis focuses on education, health, spatial planning, peace, public order, and community protection, as well as social economics. The study particularly emphasises the vulnerability of the poor in slum areas to climate change impacts. Recommendations include prioritising efforts to reduce school dropout rates, developing a low-carbon emission school assessment instrument, enhancing data collection on climate change-related diseases, integrating climate change into spatial planning policies, implementing social mapping for infrastructure and demographic adaptations, and mapping patterns of changes in occupation and residence resulting from these adaptations.



Hearing Session



We conducted a hearing session with the Deputy for Spatial Planning of the Jakarta Capital Province, the Regional Development Planning Agency (Bappeda), the Environmental Agency, and the Bureau of Development and Environment of the Jakarta Province Secretariat. By this hearing, we intend to (1) solicit input on the working paper we produce; (2) disseminate the working paper to related stakeholders.

Social and Climate Justice in the Developing World

Sink or Swim Policy Paper

In response to the need for low-carbon development and the potential impacts of climate change, the Jakarta Provincial Government issued Governor Regulation No. 90/2021, which governs the Regional Low Carbon and Climate Resilient Development Plan (RPRKD).

However, there were still several shortcomings and challenges that need to be addressed. Our findings indicate that there were structural barriers and limitations in meeting the needs of vulnerable groups. Further steps were needed to identify the impacts of adaptation policies already implemented or to be implemented.





RINGKASAN

Asia Research Centre, Universitas Indonesia (ARC UI) didirikan untuk mengatasi kesenjangan antara potensi Indonesia di dunia dan kapasitas akademisnya untuk memahami dan menjelaskan dirinya sendiri. ARC UI merupakan wadah penghubung antar-disiplin, fakultas, dan universitas di Asia dalam bidang ilmu sosial dan humaniora, serta organisasi masyarakat sipil dan komunitas kebijakan. Tujuannya adalah untuk menjadi organisasi yang taat akademis dalam membina penelitian interdisipliner yang mendalam, yang dapat diperluas ke seluruh universitas, serta terlibat dalam kolaborasi internasional dan antar-sektoral tingkat tinggi.

Kami mengadakan pertemuan tahunan pertama kami pada awal 2023, melibatkan dewan pengawas, peneliti, dan jajaran pimpinan Fakultas Ilmu Sosial dan Ilmu Politik, Universitas Indonesia. Di sana, kami memperkuat kembali tujuan kami untuk menjadi titik fokus bagi ilmu sosial kritis di Indonesia dan Asia.



Catatan Direktur

Pada tahun ketiganya, Asia Research Centre, Universitas Indonesia (ARC UI), terus mengonsolidasikan agenda akademisnya: menjadikan ilmu sosial dan humaniora lebih relevan bagi masyarakat dan kebijakan. Pada akhir tahun 2022, kami merenungkan pentingnya pemahaman lintas disiplin terhadap krisis multidimensional dan mengalokasikan waktu dan energi kami pada tahun 2023 untuk fokus mengurai evolusi dan stagnasi lama dan baru di masyarakat. Dalam proses tersebut, kami menemukan sekutu dan kawan di antara rekan-rekan kolaborator dan pendukung dari universitas mitra, organisasi masyarakat sipil, maupun komunitas kebijakan.

Dengan mendalamnya cakupan penelitian kami dan meluasnya partisipasi orang dan organisasi, kami dihadapkan pada realitas sosial bahwa bersama pertumbuhan datanglah kontradiksi. Kami menyadari bahwa semakin banyak peluang organisasi berarti semakin banyak pula tanggung jawab sosial. Kami juga semakin menyadari bahwa distribusi kekayaan dan akses yang tidak merata melibatkan gender, generasi, wilayah, dan kelas.

Pemahaman praktis dan teoretis kami tentang ketidaksetaraan mendorong kami untuk fokus pada redistribusi, atau penyetaraan alokasi sumber daya yang sebelumnya tidak merata dan akses terhadapnya. Dalam semua penelitian dan pekerjaan akademis kami, kami memproblematisasi dengan cara-cara yang beragam dan spesifik, bagaimana konsentrasi kekuasaan di tangan segelintir orang telah menyebabkan marginalisasi banyak orang.

Melakukan upaya semacam ini perlu melawan arus gagasan neoliberal di universitas dan kerasnya kondisi sosial yang tak bisa kita hindari, yang pada gilirannya meneguhkan jati diri kita sebagai akademisi. Termasuk mengakui bahwa kita semua, meskipun tidak sama rata, sama-sama rentan terhadap struktur yang menguntungkan segelintir orang saja. Dan, sekalipun tugas membaca dan menulis mungkin tak seberapa dibandingkan besarnya kesenjangan antara kenyataan dan cita-cita kita, mendengarkan kian banyak akademisi dan peneliti berbicara atas nama diri dan komunitas mereka senantiasa mengobarkan tekad bersama untuk terus maju.



DISKUSI MEDIA TENTANG PEMILU



Bekerja sama dengan Harian Kompas, kami menyelenggarakan diskusi panel "Manuver Politik dan Pemilu Indonesia 2024" dan memublikasikan artikel "Demokrasi Membutuhkan Daya Tahan"



AREA RISET

Kami memulai dengan studi multi-negara tentang COVID-19, yang memberikan kesempatan bagi para akademisi untuk berkolaborasi dalam pekerjaan-pekerjaan yang mengedepankan pemahaman komparatif tentang kawasan Asia, dengan tema besar "Pengetahuan tentang Asia." Kami menggunakan wawasan dari studi tersebut untuk menerbitkan isu khusus pertama kami dengan *Sojourn: Journal of Social Issues in Southeast Asia*.

Kami kemudian terlibat dalam penelitian lebih lanjut yang mengeksplorasi pengalaman Asia Tenggara dan Asia pada umumnya serta mengedepankan penggunaan wawasan perbandingan yang lebih luas dalam analisis kami. Penelitian kami tahun 2023 mencakup studi tentang "Pendidikan Perempuan dan Anak Perempuan di Asia Tenggara" serta "Islam dan Kaum Kiri di Indonesia" (yang merupakan bagian dari penelitian lebih luas yang membandingkan pengalaman Indonesia dan Turki).

Sepanjang tahun 2023, kami melakukan lebih banyak penelitian dengan tema "Keadilan Sosial dan Iklim di Negara Berkembang," mengambil kasus Indonesia untuk mengurai hubungan ekstraktif yang mengaitkan negeri tersebut dengan kapitalisme global. Sambil melanjutkan pekerjaan kami di bawah tema "Reorganisasi Kekuatan di Pasar Negara Berkembang," kami menambahkan penelitian baru dengan tema "Demokrasi dan Transformasi Demokratis di Belahan Bumi Selatan."

Dengan memanasnya politik pemilihan umum di Asia Tenggara setelah pandemi COVID-19, kami melihat urgensi untuk menggunakan wawasan yang didapat dari penelitian untuk merenungkan keterkaitan antara meningkatnya ketidaksetaraan dan melemahnya demokrasi. Belum pula berdiri dengan kokoh, demokrasi di Asia Tenggara kini bahkan menghadapi ganjalan-ganjalan baru yang menunjukkan adanya kemunduran besar. Memahami krisis-krisis yang saling terkait dan berdampak besar ini (dan melalui kerja sama dengan Organisasi Masyarakat Sipil) akan dapat membantu kita memperluas peluang untuk memperkuat cita-cita demokrasi.

KEPAKARAN RISET

Penelitian yang kami lakukan pada tahun 2023 menunjukkan upaya kami untuk merespons krisis multidimensional yang sedang berlangsung melalui kerja kolaboratif dan interdisipliner dengan menggunakan perspektif kritis. Secara kritis, kami merujuk pada penyelidikan yang hati-hati terhadap asumsi arus utama yang kerap tidak dipertanyakan lagi, dengan langkah-langkah yang memungkinkan cara-cara baru untuk mengajukan pertanyaan dan meneliti masalah-masalah yang ada, sesuai kebutuhan.



Di atas adalah peta berkembang kata kunci penelitian kami, yang bersifat interdisipliner dalam hal karakter dan praktik. Peta ini diperbarui setiap tahun dengan mendapatkan masukan dari para peneliti kami, sehingga akan berkembang seiring waktu. Para peneliti memberi tahu kami apa yang relevan di bidang mereka, dan kami menghubungkan minat mereka dengan peneliti yang sejalan dari disiplin lain. Melihat peta ini bertransformasi seiring makin banyaknya akademisi yang bekerja bersama kami adalah sebuah kesenangan tersendiri.

PENGEMBANGAN AKADEMIS

Melalui kolaborasi akademis dan kegiatan pembimbingan, kami memperdalam keterlibatan kami dengan ilmuwan sosial kritis yang berinteraksi dengan aktivis kelas pekerja di wilayah Asia. Kami merancang kegiatan kami pada tahun 2023 untuk memajukan kerja sama lintas disiplin dan menghubungkan akademisi di universitas dengan aktivis dan Organisasi Masyarakat Sipil. Mereka memperoleh wawasan dari, dan juga turut membentuk, permasalahan penelitian kami.


Kami sangat senang menjadi tuan rumah konferensi Historical Materialism (HM) pertama yang akan berlangsung di Asia Tenggara, bekerja sama dengan Asian Labour Review (ALR) dan IndoPROGRESS (IP). Kami menyelaraskan konferensi ini dengan proyek HM yang lebih luas untuk mendukung konsolidasi jaringan akademisi-aktivis kritis lintas Asia.

Selain itu, kami bekerja sama dengan pusat-pusat studi Asia di seluruh dunia untuk menyelenggarakan acara pertukaran pengetahuan tentang Asia. Kami memilih topik yang relevan dengan Asia kontemporer: politik pemilihan umum, politik pekerjaan gig, respons perlindungan sosial COVID-19. Kami mendorong para akademisi yang meneliti wilayah Asia secara lebih luas untuk berpikir secara komparatif guna memahami masyarakat kami sendiri.







RELEVANSI

Sepanjang tahun 2023, kami melakukan diversifikasi luaran penelitian dengan cara yang dapat meningkatkan keterlibatan kami dengan masyarakat luas. Strategi tersebut telah meningkatkan relevansi kami bagi komunitas kebijakan dan masyarakat umum.

Pada awal 2023, para peneliti kami yang bekerja di bawah tema “Keadilan Sosial dan Iklim di Negara Berkembang” menghasilkan sebuah kertas kebijakan tentang “Pengarusutamaan Pembangunan Rendah Karbon yang Tahan terhadap Perubahan Iklim: Studi Kasus Kawasan Pesisir Utara Jakarta.” Kami juga memprakarsai sesi dengar pendapat untuk mendiskusikan kebijakan tersebut dengan aktor strategis di jajaran Pemerintahan Provinsi DKI Jakarta. Mereka meliputi Deputi Bidang Tata Ruang di Badan Perencanaan Pembangunan Daerah (Bappeda) DKI Jakarta, Dinas Lingkungan Hidup DKI Jakarta, dan Biro Pembangunan dan Lingkungan Hidup.

Kami juga bekerja bersama media populer untuk merespons situasi kontemporer. Pada akhir 2023, kami bekerja sama dengan Kompas, surat kabar berbahasa Indonesia terbesar di Indonesia, untuk menyelenggarakan diskusi panel tentang “Manuver Politik dan Pemilu Indonesia 2024.” Wawasan dari diskusi panel tersebut, yang diperoleh dari penelitian kami bertema “Demokrasi dan Transformasi Demokratis di Belahan Bumi Selatan,” diliput di halaman utama surat kabar Kompas.

Selain itu, kami bekerja sama dengan 360info, platform media daring berbasis di Australia, untuk memproduksi laporan khusus tentang “Mengatasi Risiko Pekerjaan Gig.” Laporan ini, yang diselenggarakan di bawah payung penelitian “Reorganisasi Kekuatan di Pasar Negara Berkembang,” merefleksikan pengalaman Asia Selatan dan Tenggara melalui enam artikel tentang pekerjaan gig dan politiknya di Indonesia, Malaysia, India, dan Nepal. Lisensi konten 360info di bawah Creative Commons 4.0 memungkinkan untuk republikasi setiap artikel oleh platform media lain di seluruh Asia.

Kami berencana untuk menyelenggarakan kolaborasi semacam ini dengan Kompas dan 360info (dan platform media lainnya) setiap tahun, sebagai cara untuk menyebarluaskan wawasan dari penelitian akademis kami. Kolaborasi ini telah menambah nilai lebih pada publikasi kami di berbagai platform (the Jakarta Post, Melbourne Asia Review, Penerbit Kompas Gramedia) dan akun media sosial ARC UI.

Dokumen kebijakan ini merupakan respons terhadap Peraturan Gubernur DKI Jakarta Nomor 90 Tahun 2021 tentang Rencana Pembangunan Rendah Karbon Daerah yang Berketahanan Iklim. Dokumen ini menganalisis potensi dan keterbatasan rencana untuk meningkatkan layanan dasar berketahanan iklim di wilayah pesisir Jakarta Utara.
